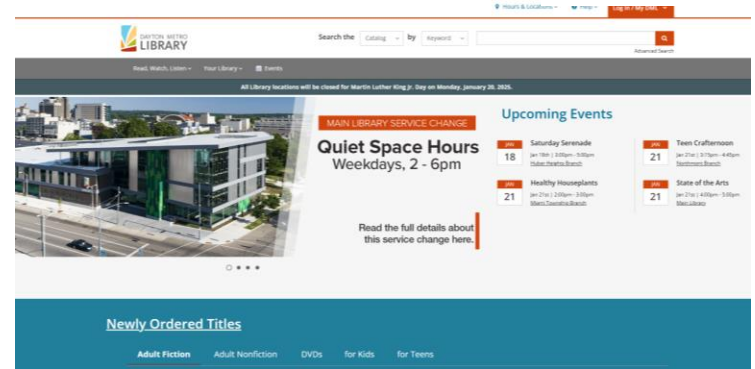




I'm Going to the Huber Heights Branch

How to Get to the Library

- The library's address is 6243 Brandt Pike ([map](#))
- Before I go, I can look up driving directions on my phone or online.
- If I am taking the bus, I can look up the routes and times online or on the Metro Transit app.
- I can park in the parking lot behind the library.

I can ask for help at the Children's Ask Me desk.



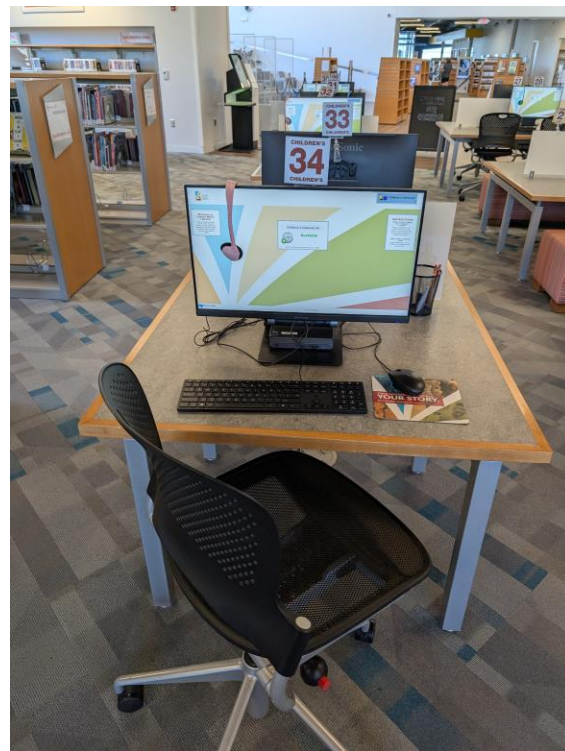
I can play on the Nintendo Switch.

If I have trouble checking out I can go to the
Ask Me Desk for help.



These are security gates. Sometimes they make a loud noise when people walk through them. If it makes a loud noise when I walk through, I can go to the Ask Me Desk for help.
